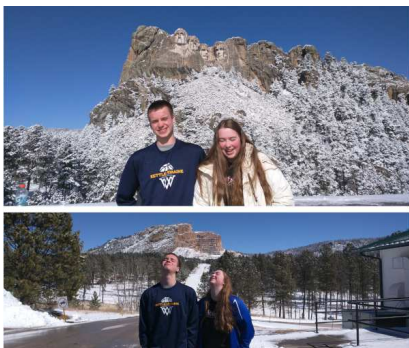
## FREE BEER
